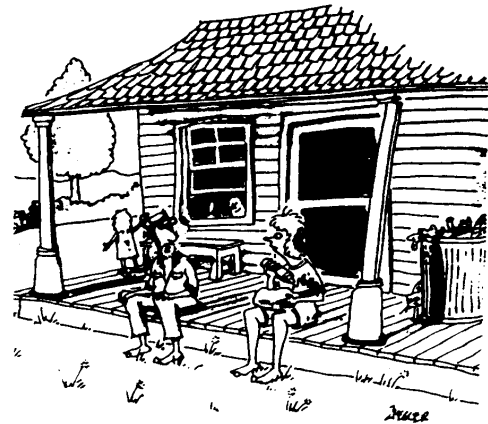
Friendly reminder the outdoor season is starting April 29th. The first Scramble!

It's hard to believe that our first outdoor Scramble is next month! We've had a great **Indoor Season**, thanks in large part to the efforts of Darold Jones, Don DeLoach, and John McGrath. Darold has built a great relationship with **Manitou Springs High School**, in whose gym there have already been four flying sessions since the first of the year.

Don helped organize the Manitou sessions and spearheaded a very successful **Pikes Peak Ceiling Climb** at the Colorado Springs City Auditorium on January 28th. He CD'd the event.

John McGrath's long-term leadership in **Science Olympiad**, as Event Supervisor for the Sci Oly Southern Colorado Regionals, continues to strengthen our outreach in this very important venue in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) field. Importantly, MMM members helped at the Southern Colorado Regionals on Feb. 17th. A number of the regular fliers at our indoor events are Sci Oly students. They're a welcome addition to our sport!

We had the best of intentions to hold a final Coupe Contest and Scramble at **Edwards Free Flight Base** in Colorado Springs on Sunday, February 18th. Alas, the weather wasn't on board with this, so instead, several of us had lunch at the Radisson Hotel next to The Airplane Restaurant. It was a great time. The Leadership Council will soon begin exploring the possibility of finding a replacement for Good Ol' Edwards.

The **Crosswinds RC Club**, one of our fellow tenant organizations on Lowry, recently invited us to give a short presentation on free flight at their monthly meeting on March 14th. Jerry Murphy is organizing the details, including a slide presentation. Several guys will bring models to show. This is a great way to get to know Crosswinds better. We'll reciprocate by asking them to give us a similar presentation on their activities, possibly at our Annual Business Meeting in December. In the meantime, Jerry and Rick Pangell spoke with the Crosswinds president at a recent AMA District IX meeting and suggested that Crosswinds join us at our April 29 Scramble—for a **mass-launch of AMA Alpha rubber models**. (That's Rob Romash's design.) Stay tuned for more.

F1E Team Selection Finals. We were approached by Bob Sifleet, chairman of the F1E Slope Soaring Team Selection Committee. The result is that we will be hosting the F1E Finals at Indian Point, north of the Lowry field on Friday, June 22, 2018. John McGrath has graciously offered to CD this very important contest. We'll keep you posted in the coming months.

To help the MMM prepare for our "major" contests (the Ceiling Climb, the 14 Rounder, and the Rocky Mountain Championships), we now have a **Major Contest Management Team**. The seven members of the Team are: Mark Covington, Don DeLoach, Chuck Etherington, John McGrath, Pete McQuade, Jerry Murphy, and Tom Norell. The team has already met twice and will meet again, as necessary. Our goal is to ensure these nationally-prominent contests are planned for, prepared for, and executed excellently.

If you have an older FAI model (Nordic glider, Wakefield, or FAI Power), please consider flying it in our **Legacy FAI events**. We'll be featuring Legacy FAI in the Scrambles all year, as well as in the 14 Rounder and the Rocky Mountain Champs. To sweeten the deal, there'll be a \$10 cash prize for the top score in Legacy FAI at each Scramble. The rules for Legacy will regularly appear in The MaxOut. So, dust off those old models and come re-discover the fun and excitement of FAI flying. Remember, our models were never intended to sit in a box, collecting dust.

Next time you see **Rick Pangell**, NFFS Central region Vice President and our faithful MaxOut Editor, thank him for another great issue of our newsletter. It's the glue that holds our club together.

Hello Fellow Free Flighters in District IX,

As your representative on the Free Flight Contest Board I need your feedback on the proposals currently before the board so that I might accurately represent your views in the casting of my votes. The process goes like this. There are three rounds of voting. The first round is to filter out those proposals that deserve additional consideration in the Cross-proposal phase. Those proposals not moved forward will be rejected in this first round of voting. The votes must be in to AMA by the first of May.

In addition to these proposals, there are two Indoor proposals and your feedback on them needs to go to Don DeLoach who is your District IX board member.

The proposals I need your feedback on are as follows and the full text of the proposals can be found on the AMA web at

OFF19-03 Submitted by Jerry Murphy. This proposal will sunset those events no longer being flown a general free flight competition. When they are flown they have been reduced to being participation award events. Events will be removed based on the number of Nats entries. The reason for basing the criteria on the Nats is there are no records on events outside of the Nats.

OFF19-06 Submitted by Don DeLoach. This proposal will define the CLG as a solid handle with a maximum length of the rubber to be 9 inches.

OFF19-07 Submitted by Aram Schlosberg. This proposal increases the fly off max times for E-36, A electric and B electric

OFF19-08 Submitted by Aram Schlosberg. This proposal will add the requirement of a measurement of static Wattage to determine the motor run time for E-36. Please refer to the full text of these proposals on the AMA web.

OFF19-09 Submitted by Aram Schlosberg. This proposal will add an Auto Rudder to E-36 to improve trimming.

OFF19-10 Submitted by Bob Miller This proposal will remove the limit of models allowed.

Gen 19-01 Submitted by Jerry Murphy. This proposal will do away with the practice of setting AMA national records in events not flown.

This applies in cases where a limited performance class is flown and the recorded score also exceeds that of the higher performance class. An example would be where a flyer sets a new records in Classic gas and that record is also greater than the current record in AMA gas even though the flyer did not fly AMA gas. This is current practice in Indoor.

Gen19-02 Submitted by Don Slusarczyk. This proposal will retrain the current practice of setting multiple records at the discretion of the specific Contest Board.

Gen19-03 Submitted by Don DeLoach. This proposal will allow the setting of records in events sanctioned as AMA Record Trials with the same requirements as those of AMA Sanctioned contests.

So, here is your home work. Review these proposals, talk about them with your flying buddies and email me your thoughts. Also if you know of somebody I missed on this distribution, please forward it to them.

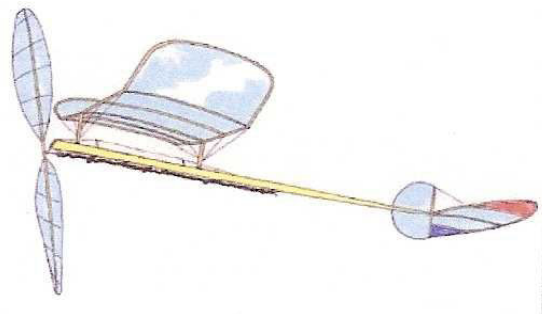

Thanks to Darold's good works we have a very good relationship with the Manitou Springs High School. This became obvious when the math/ physics teacher Mike Talbott, approached Darold to ask if it would be possible to give his students a model airplane experience. Yes, he came to us!
Darold took the lead in this project and he arranged for John McGrath to provide Mountain Lion kits for the project and then he rounded up helpers, Don DeLoach, Chuck Etherington, and me.

John's Mountain Lion model is an ideal candidate for events like this. Setting up in the cafeteria worked well as there was ample room for both the students and helpers to build the models. We had eight students and the total construction time was about 45 minutes. The models went together with no problems with the exception of the spray adhesive. It was a Bordon brand and it failed to adequately adhere the tissue to the frame work of the model.

After the models were assembled it was off to the gym for flying. EVERY MODEL FLEW ! Asking the students if they were surprised by how well the models flew everybody said they were. We had a mass launch contest that was exciting and fun. The contest had to go a second round as there was a tie in the first round.

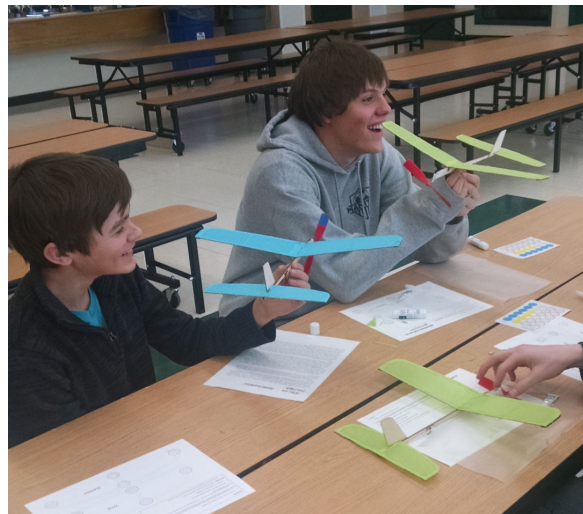
The students kept us busy with winding models until it was time for them to go home. I suspect that there were about 100 flights made that afternoon.

Now for the really good news. The principal Glenn Hard and his assistant Jessie Hall came to watch the students fly and both were impressed with the performance of the models. Not only were they impressed, they saw exactly what we do when we are in the gym. This will pay off big time if somebody raises objections to us because they think model airplanes are big heavy RC models.

I suspect this event could lead us to being involved with STEM activities. As we learned at the District IX meeting AMA is working on class room STEM teaching guides.

Again thanks to Darold for leading this program.

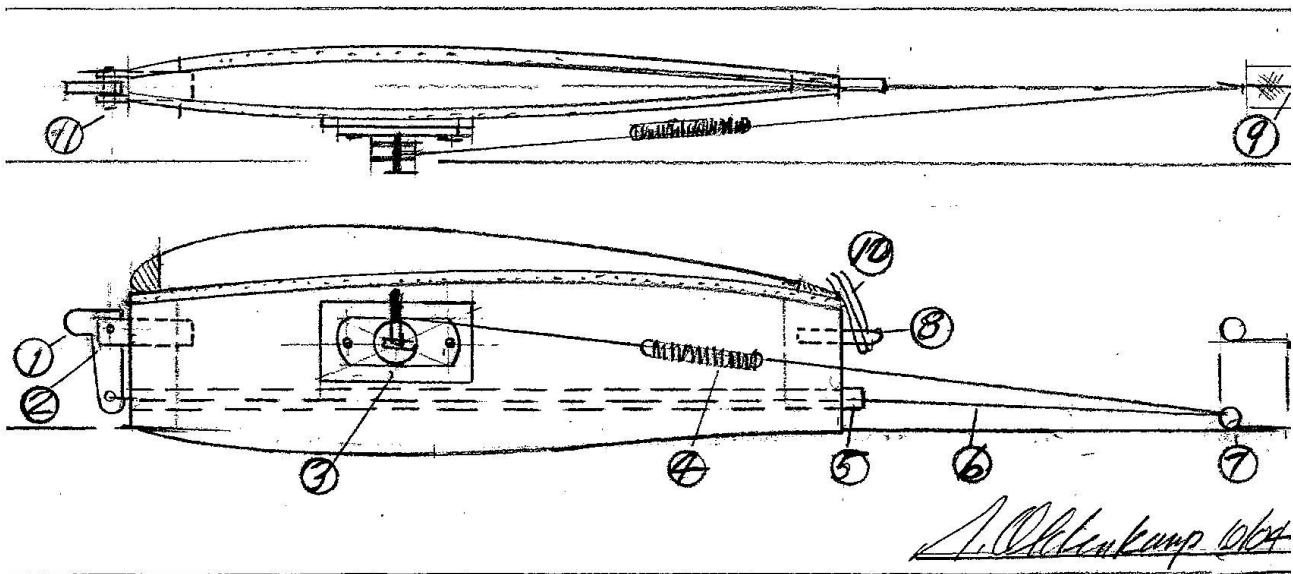

Ever wonder how to Pop that Wing DT on your P-30 or other lightweight Model ?

One further rookie rant: Try to place the timer with plenty of finger clearance in order to arm, change, and make lanyard hookups without fouling the system while winding, hooking up the prop, and doing air picks. Various pull-out locking pins should be fitted so that your system can be set in "Park" while the needed preliminaries are performed.

Three of the five systems so far are on P-30s. Each follows almost exactly the details shown below in the Larry Bagalini P-30 Pop-Off Wing Dethermalizer. Users should know that this drawing differs slightly from the ruff passed out at the club meeting, as do some of the annotations. Suffice to say that Larry's solution is clever, lightweight, and ultra reliable. John and Greg Hutchison have used it successfully:



Drawing is full size, shows top and side views, and is in the "armed" state. Front rubber band over crank is omitted for clarity.

1. Bellcrank made from thin plastic, aluminum, or plywood. Drill 1/32 holes for axle and lanyard attachment. Top corner may need to be radiussed to clear pylon.
2. 1/8" aluminum tube bellcrank mount. Sharpen and drill full of end grained balsa plus C/A glue. Drill hole for axle. File slot well past axle point. C/A into pylon, leaving clearance shown.
3. Viscous Timer as sold by FliteTech, FAI, Peck, or G. Sullivan
4. Light pressure spring from FliteTech, or old Ballpoint pen.
5. Small diameter plastic cocktail straw runs through pylon.
