Wrapping up the 2012 year. It came to a close with some open items, but nothing serious.

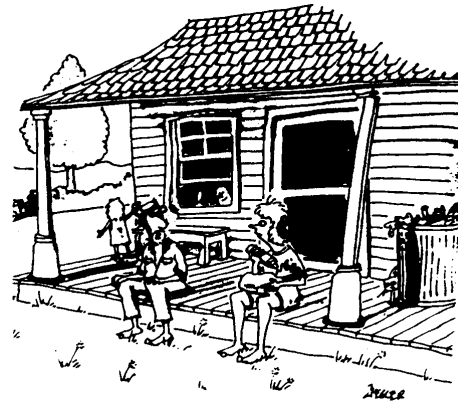
Jerry Murphy is the prez, but for only one year so think about 2014! He is a pretty busy guy and it's time for new blood in the pipes.

2013 Scramble Rules

At the 2012 annual meeting the topic of the MMM Scramble came up when it was suggested that the E-36 event had an advantage because the current Scramble rules permit flying the fly-off flights at the same motor run as the first three flights.

As a reminder, the Scramble rules call for all events to be flown to a three-flight format with the max time being either 120 or 180 seconds. If a competitor posts three maxs then they continue to fly with the same motor run and max as the first three rounds.

This simplified set of rules results in all model classes being approximately equal in that the various handicaps in the event rules make obtaining a max about as tough no matter what event is being flown.

A vote was called for the Scramble to be flown to the full rules of each event. The discussion following this vote uncovered several complex issues with this flying to the rules proposal, so a second vote of the club instructed the club leadership to research the issues and come up with a proposal.

This topic has been the source of many conversations and email traffic trying to flush out the details of the proposal to fly to the rules. The problems come down to first the differences between FAI events that are flown to more than three flights and the various fly-off rules that are designed to prevent marathon events.

After all of this I made the decision as club president to keep the current Scramble rules in effect as they have proven to be successful in getting enhanced participation in our monthly meets. The basic concept of a max being a max is simple and has shown to work. The E-36 topic remain open, so I am asking all E-36 competitors to voluntarily reduce their fly-off motor runs to 10 seconds for the May and June Scrambles. We will then have some real live on the field data to drive a decision on the E-36 fly-off issue.

Please take a minute to thank the club leadership for all the time and energy they put into this issue. I believe the result is an even better Scramble.

Magnificent Mountain Men Annual Meeting Dec 8, 2012

20 people were in attendance

It's been a great year. First and foremost, thanks to Marc and Carol Sisk for hosting the meeting and providing lunch and beverages.

MMM 2012 Year in Review – Marc Sisk

Detailed review of the year's activities. Since not all members had been involved in all the club activities, this review brings everyone up to date.

MMM Finances – Chuck Etherington

Chuck gave a financial report referencing the handout entitled "statement of finances."

Membership Dues – Marc Sisk

The club dues will remain \$40/yr (crossover from SAM1 \$20, MaxOut subscription \$15).

Lowry Field Lease/Other Cost Sharing (MMM/SAM1) – Marc Sisk/Duane Hjerleid

Marc and Duane agreed upon continuing the field expense concept we used in 2012. Field lease and field maintenance costs will be borne by each club as a function of membership numbers. 2012 saw a membership ratio of 11/39.

Lowry Field Status – Pete McQuade

Pete brought the club up to date on our presentation to the State Land Board and our relationship with Mindy Gottsegen (Stewardship Trust/Conservation Services Manager), our new 10-yr lease, bird avoidance training and the riparian corridors, and Conoco/Phillips oil & gas drilling lease.

Edwards Field Status – Marc Sisk

A new lease was signed with Harley Edwards. The lease and land use agreements remain the same as 2012.

US Air Force Academy (USAFA) Indoor Flying Status – Pete McQuade

Billy Crisler, who is in charge of the USAFA's outreach program for Colorado, arranged for us to have access to the USAFA field house through helping cadets with the practical application of their Fundamentals of Aeronautics course. They received bonus points for flight distance of their self-designed balsa gliders.

Bylaws Update – Chuck Etherington

The club governing bylaws were amended to include the establishment of an MMM Hall of Fame which complements the current Lifetime Membership recognition. Minor changes were also made to better reflect the current Leadership Council function. The revision was passed.

MMM Outreach – Marc Sisk, Others

- Jerry Murphy discussed the outreach opportunity with the Manitou Springs High School.
- Wings Over The Rockies (WOTR) Modeling Expo will be held Feb 23, 2013. The MMM Club will be participating with a display table and models. A list of models needed and a sign up will be sent out as the event draws nearer.
- Pueblo Weisbrod Aircraft Museum will feature an Armed Forces Day event on May 18, 2013. The MMM Club will be participating with a display table and models.
- Randy Reynolds led a discussion on membership drive issues and ideas.

Other Topic Discussion

Chuck Etherington discussed presenting the Arapahoe Hunt Caretaker, Irvine Manuelito, with an award for returning many lost models and for being a good friend of the MMM over the past 13 yrs. Randy Reynolds talked about the E-36 clinic he hosted in his shop and the possibility of having other scheduled clinic/show & tell events.

Jerry Murphy showed the scramble survey results.

A scramble rule change to handicap E-36 was proposed. That led to a larger discussion about using the existing AMA, FAI and SAM individual event rules for the scramble. The club approved adopting those rules but it was tabled until scoring/tracking concerns could be addressed.

Polecat wins NZ Nats

Like you Don, I too had a good Nats-runner up FF Champ and runner up Champion Modeller-but I thought you'd be most pleased to hear about your Polecat Mk5 cleaning up in P-30 at this year's 65th NZ Nationals-with the only full house. Its taken me since 1982-30 years-to win P-30 at the Nats.

Unfortunately lost the model on the final flight-at 8 mins+ through binos, still climbing. There was a DT fuse ban in place, and that useless so and so Dave Burley still hasn't sent my PST timers three months after ordering and paying for them so I had to fly it locked down. My wife placed third with my 'Marie' (built in Israel in '99 during my tour of duty with the UN) so it wasn't a bad day for US P-30 designs!

I don't know if you recall-but back in March 2006 (I still have the clearly postmarked box!) I got two sets of laser cut ribs for the Polecat Mk5 plus a plan-well I *finally* got around to building it Feb 2012 (after last year's Nats, where I lost yet another P-30.....on reflection I've lost more P-30s over the years than any other FF class!)-and only finished it not long before Xmas. It had one trimming session-where it proved to be on trim exactly as built, the pop wing DT worked like a treat, and back it went in the box ready for the Nats.

So yet another scalp you can add to its contest record-'NZ Nationals winner 2013.

AN ELUSIVE MOUSETRAP

Hank Nystrom was reading on our yahoo group about my dissertation on finding the Talon, radio trackers and some of the problems with them. There are many incorporations of where and how to mount them, and for free flight, almost a necessity nowadays. He sent me a photo of some of his ideas and I asked him to elaborate a bit.

Being the nice guy Hank is, he sent me enough to put together a little article. The simple explanation is he makes little plastic half bubbles" on a vacuum form.

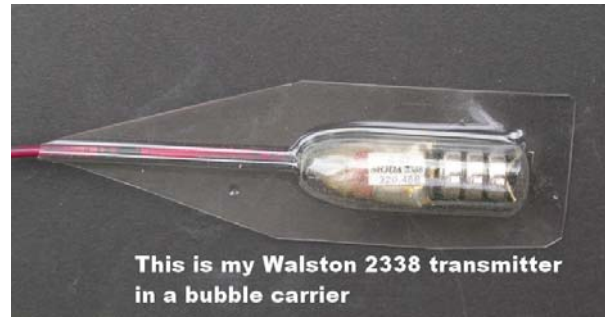
"These are what my bubbles look like. The bubble gets cut out of the sheet and makes a rectangle that gets trapped under some "Ls" on the fuselage top. The antenna comes out where the end gets trimmed off.

Different sizes for different model transmitters.



The molds are made from standard wood dowels that are cut down to the size needed for the particular transmitter. I use the 2338 model from Walston so the photos show that. The place for the antenna exit is made with a standard piece of music wire.

The bubble is held in place with an "L" shape where the bubble edges simple slide in. I use a plastic tube for the rest of the antenna.



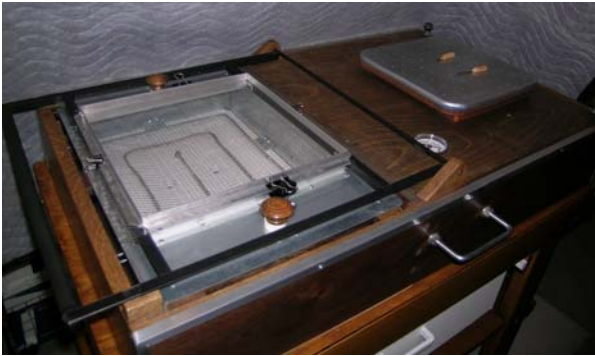
I am putting a transmitter on my new electric Maverick (407 square inches) for AMA A/B and transmitter installed using the bubble.



This photo shows the slide in holder I made for the transmitter bubble. The flanges left after I trim the bubble from the forming sheet are trapped under the 1/32 ply rails. If it needs to be tighter, I just add a slip of paper under the transmitter. The bubble weighs 0.9 g and the 1/32 ply holder is 1.6 g. The antenna is held in place with a few pieces of small straw tubing along the top of the fuselage.

My forming table is "professional grade". The heater is a long serpentine of coiled nichrome wire. I have a 6 CFM vacuum pump that can pull down to a near perfect vacuum in a fraction of a second. This is NOT a Mattel toy with a vacuum cleaner.

The plastic I use is 0.015 thick PETG film. I can handle lots of different types of film and thicknesses, but this works well for my needs. The PETG softens at a moderately high temperature and cuts cleanly with a hobby blade. I have tables as large as 12 by 18 inches, but seldom need anything that large. The photo shows a 12x12 inch table, which is my default standard.



On the left is the film carrier with the heating coils and on the right is the vacuum table with all the holes to pull the high vacuum. The heated film is quickly lowered over the master forms and then the pump is started to pull it down instantly.

This photo shows the control panel for the operation.



Two meters show input power and actual vacuum. The side view shows two master molds for the Walston. You can see the flat side on the table.

CLEANING LASER-CUT PARTS

When building a kit with laser-cut parts, the usual procedure is to sand clean the burnt edges of the parts because charcoal to charcoal (carbon is what discolors the pads) joints are weak. A much quicker method involves wiping the part edges clean with hydrogen peroxide solution straight out of the bottle with a cotton swab or a sponge. The stuff is not dangerous - be sure you are using the 3% peroxide - and is readily available over the counter at most drug stores.

Best results appear to be achieved with a brand new bottle of peroxide solution, one that has not been opened before. Peroxide solution is very unstable and rapidly breaks down into water and oxygen once the container is opened. After treatment, if you're in a hurry for the parts to dry, place the pads on a paper towel and pop them into a microwave oven at 10% power for a couple of minutes. Repeat procedure if needed, but don't over cook them.
